### School Photos

### Arrival and Departure Times

We are aware that arrival and departure times for students may vary depending on family circumstances and transport arrangements for each family, however if possible, it is best if students arrive between 8.40 and 8.50 so that they are ready for the start of the school day when the first bell goes at 8.50am. We have teachers on duty between 8.45am and 9.00am and also after school between 3.30pm and 3.45pm for students who may need assistance.

**If you need to drop your child at school prior to 8.40am or if you are unable to pick them up before 3.50pm, we recommend that you enrol them in our OSHclub program, to ensure their safety and long term wellbeing.**

To ensure that our attendance rolls are accurate, if your child arrives at school after 9:00 am, they will need to go straight to the Office so that they can be signed into Compass and be given a token to pass on to their classroom teacher. If your child needs to leave school at any time for an appointment and/or for an early dismissal, parents or carers need to come into the Office to arrange collection and to allow Office staff to record the early departure time. Please note that unless a request is received in writing, students can only be released to a known adult. Similarly, students cannot leave the school ground **by themselves** at any time throughout the school day unless a written request from a parent/guardian is sent to the school and permission is given by the Principal.

### Parent/Guardian/Visitor Sign-in and Sign-out Requirements

For emergency purposes, all parents/guardians and visitors who are in the school during the school day, between 9.00am – 3.30pm, must sign in on the Passtab device in the School Office on arrival and sign out when departing.

### Newsletters Distributed Fortnightly

Compass, our online communication portal, is our main communication device and it enables us to send important messages to our school community on a regular basis and at point of need, which is a real benefit to our school. In addition to the other messages sent out on Compass, we also distribute a school newsletter on a fortnightly basis which highlights the important events and contains valuable information for our school community.

## Mobile Phones & Wearable Communication Devices

We understand that students may bring a personal mobile phone or a wearable communication device to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school. Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and stored in the school office during school hours. **Students who have the Principal's approval must place their phone in the school office before 9.00 am and then for collect them from the Office at 3.30 pm.** Wearable communication devices, such as watches, can be switched on throughout the day, but the communication function must be turned off during school hours. ## Playground Safety

To prevent accidents, students are not permitted to ride bikes, scooters or skate boards in the school or across the front of the school at any time. **To ensure safety for all our students, we do not allow students to play on the playground equipment before school at any time; and students are only allowed to play on the equipment after school if supervised by their parents.** Please also note that school rules related to playground and equipment use apply at all times.

## Student Insurance Schemes

It is important to remind parents that the Department of Education and Training (DET) does not provide personal accident insurance for students and that parents/guardians are responsible for paying the costs of medical treatment for injured students, including transport costs e.g. ambulance. Student insurance can be privately purchased and is available from commercial insurers. The DET cannot advise parents/guardians on whether to purchase a student accident policy or which policy to purchase

## Ambulance Cover

We also strongly advise all parents to join an Ambulance cover scheme because the costs for transport can be very high. In the event of an emergency requiring additional medical intervention it is a DET requirement that we call an Ambulance to transport children to hospital irrespective of whether parents have ambulance cover or not. While this decision is not taken lightly, and we will make every effort to contact parents, this is not always possible and can be costly for families without ambulance cover.

## Safe Travel To and From School

It is important that parents discuss their expectations about how their children travel to and from school and how to be safe. It is safer if the students travel directly to and from school and that they do not play in transit.

## Non Smoking Area

As a government department, the school is a non-smoking area and smoking is not permitted anywhere on the school grounds

## Personal belongings

All belongings, including clothing, must be clearly marked with the student's name and should be checked regularly to ensure all items remain clearly marked. Please do not allow students to bring valuable items to school as the DET and Strathfieldsaye Primary School do not hold insurance for personal property and valuable items brought to school by students, staff or parents.

## Money brought to school

It is requested that money be sent in a sealed envelope with the student's name, home group, amount and the reason for its enclosure on the front of the envelope. Any money that is sent to school with your child must be handed directly to the office. When siblings bring money for other family members, please mark this clearly on the envelope with written details of each student, home group and teacher

## Dogs on School Grounds

Please also note that, with the exception of education support dogs and therapy/guide dogs, dogs are not permitted in the school grounds and we would ask parents not to bring dogs to school, even if they are on leads.

## Safe Driving and Parking around School

We have been advised by the City of Greater Bendigo to alert parents to the following information regarding parking and driving near schools. The responsibility for student safety is an important one for the whole community and I would ask all drivers to take particular care around school zones.

*"The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to schools is a major concern to the safety of children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with the parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school. Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, park or drive on resident's nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park.*

*A number of schools have time restricted areas that assist with the pickup and drop off of students and these restrictions must be adhered to. **Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.** The law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.*

**City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police will conduct random patrols throughout the school year to ensure that motorists are adhering to the road rules."**

## SPS STEM Program 2023

This year SPS is implementing STEM as a specialist area for all students P-6. STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, and incorporates the elements of the Science curriculum as well as the technologies curriculum incorporating Design and Technology as well as the Digital Technologies.

Design and Technology curriculum is all about using the principles of engineering and design to solve problems. These problems can be as simple as making a small bridge, or as large as solving Australia's future energy needs and dealing with climate change. In addition to this there are also elements of food and fibre production, materials and technologies and food specialisations. All of the design elements are covered using a process of investigating potential solutions, generating ideas and designing plans, producing and evaluating the final product in relation to the original problem posed. In this element of STEM, resilience, patience and tenacity is required, and often we learn more from our failures, than from our successes.

The Digital Technologies component is based on digital systems which students are familiar with at on a daily basis. The elements of the curriculum focus on data and information- how digital systems store, share and manage data within itself and how that data may be transmitted over different networks both public and private. Digital Systems, which is the different components of digital devices, mainly listed as input, output and storage elements. The final element is creating digital solutions which involves coding and programming using a variety of different tools.

## A Message from our School Chaplain

I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Lynley Jordan. I am the **Chaplain** here at Strathfieldsaye PS. I work at the school on **Thursdays** and **Fridays**. My role is really varied, but one of the things I undertake includes preparing and running **Breakfast Club every Friday morning**.

## A Message from The City of Greater Bendigo

### Increased Mosquito Activity and Threat of Arbovirus in Greater Bendigo Region

The City of Greater Bendigo region has been identified as having increased Mosquito activity through its mosquito surveillance program. Some of the mosquitos identified by the surveillance program are capable of carrying infectious diseases. Over the coming weeks, we expect the population of mosquitos to continue to increase, resulting in a higher risk of exposure to these infectious diseases.

Management of mosquitos requires a community effort. You can protect yourself by doing the following:

- Wear loose fitting clothing when outdoors.
- Use effective mosquito repellents on exposed skin containing DEET or picaridin.

You can increase your protection by:

- Ensuring your buildings are fitted with well maintained flyscreens or other physical insect barriers.
- Checking any rainwater tanks and water storage devices are sealed or fitted with mesh screens.

If you have identified increased mosquito at your premises, I encourage you to engage a licensed pest controller to assist you identify and apply appropriate chemical controls at your site.

Should you identify areas in your neighbourhood supporting the breeding of mosquitos, please do not hesitate in notifying the City. Together we can minimise the spread of mosquito borne disease in our community.

# CASEA IS COMING TO STRATHFIELDSAYE!



The CASEA (CAMHS and Schools Early Action) Program is part of Bendigo Health's Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) and will be working with our school in 2023.

- CASEA is an early intervention program that aims to improve children's social and emotional development, promote connection, understanding, wellbeing and problem solving. CASEA helps children and adults to recognise strong feelings (like worry, anger or stress) and work together to get through tricky times.
- The CASEA team will be working with our school offering parent/carer information and support sessions, working with school staff and the whole school community.
- There is also a small-group part of the program designed for children in early primary school and their parents/caregivers that will be running in term 2.
- The program is free for your family and also the school.




