Principal's Report

2023 Swimming Program We are so very pleased to be able to hold swimming lessons for our students once again this year. The school and DET are covering the cost of the swimming instruction through Sloan Swimming School. and we are asking parents to contribute to the cost of the bus travel and entry to the pool. Our Foundation, Gr 1 & Gr 2 students will begin their lessons on Monday 4 Dec and our Gr 3-6 students will start their lessons on Mon 11 Dec.

On the request of Sloan Swimming School, we asked all parents to complete an on line form outlining their child's current swimming ability to enable children to be placed in a group that best fits there current skills. Unfortunately, a few families overlooked the uploading of the required information regarding their children's swimming abilities. If you have not yet uploaded this information, please call the Office and the admin team will ask you some relevant questions and they will upload this information into the for you, so that your child can be placed in the correct group.

Grade 2 Pizza and Movie Night Thank you to the Gr 2 staff who gave up their time to support our Gr 2 students during their 'after school' pizza and movie night experience, which is an important part of our camping program. It was lovely to pop in and see our Gr 2 students enjoying their movie with their teachers and friends.

Grade 5 Camp Our Grade 5 students and their teachers will head off to their camp in Queenscliff on Mon 20 Nov and I am sure they will have an amazing time. Thank you to the Year 5 staff and our parent helpers who will be giving up their time to accompany our students at the Queenscliff camp.

Grade 1 Tabloid Sports and Piza Night Next Thursday 30 Nov, our Gr 1 students will enjoy their first taste of our camping program when they participate in some tabloid sports and enjoy some pizza with their classmates after school. Thank you in advance to our Gr 1 teaching team for organising this activity and giving up their time to ensure their students can enjoy this special experience.

State-wide Orientation Session Tuesday12 Dec is the State Wide Orientation Day for all government school students. Our Gr 6 students will be heading off to their Secondary Colleges for the day, our 2024 Foundation students will be spending the morning with us once again, and all our current students will be heading into their 2024 grades for the morning.

2024 Class Placement Process Over the last five weeks, school staff have invested many hours considering our students' social, emotional and academic requirements, their friendship requests and any individual student needs that have been shared by parents so that we can put together the best possible combinations for our 2024 classes. With careful consideration, we have been able to ensure that each child has been placed with one or more of the friends they requested and we have also been able to accommodate most of the parent requests that we received.

Given the time and careful consideration that has already been put into this process, I wanted to let parents know that we will not have the flexibility to make any changes to class groupings from this point on. If your child has any worries about their class placement after they participate in their orientation session on Tuesday 12 Dec. please chat to your child's 2023 classroom teacher and let them know so that they can help support your child in getting to know their new classmates and work through their worries prior to the end of the year.

2024 Room Changes Next year, we have decided to turn our current Gr 2 classrooms into a Specialist Hub. Rm 9 will become our STEM Room, Rm 10 will be our Performing Arts Room, Rm 11 will be our LOTE Room and Rm 12 will be our Digital Technologies Room on Mon-Wed and Chaplain's Room on Thu-Fri. 





Congratulations to all the students who participated in this event, and a special congratulations to the following students who received awards for their wonderful submissions.




The Best Design Award, Grade 3-4 Category: Stella T Grade 3



The Best Design Award, Grade 5-6 Category: Olivia W, Grade 6





A Message from The City of Greater Bendigo

Increased Mosquito Activity and Threat of Arbovirus in Greater Bendigo Region

The City of Greater Bendigo region has been identified as having increased Mosquito activity through its mosquito surveillance program. Some of the mosquitos identified by the surveillance program are capable of carrying infectious diseases. Over the coming weeks, we expect the population of mosquitos to continue to increase, resulting in a higher risk of exposure to these infectious diseases

Management of mosquitos requires a community effort. You can protect yourself by doing the following:

- Wear loose fitting clothing when outdoors.
- Use effective mosquito repellents on exposed skin containing DEET or picaridin.


You can increase your protection by:


- Ensuring your buildings are fitted with well maintained flyscreens or other physical insect barriers.
- Checking any rainwater tanks and water storage devices are sealed or fitted with mesh screens.


If you have identified increased mosquito at your premises, I encourage you to engage a licensed pest controller to assist you identify and apply appropriate chemical controls at your site.

Should you identify areas in your neighbourhood supporting the breeding of mosquitos, please do not hesitate in notifying the City. Together we can minimise the spread of mosquito borne disease in our community.
