**Welcome to 2024** - I would like to welcome everyone to the start of the 2024 school year and give a special welcome to all of our new students and their families. Our students have settled into their classroom routines and they are building positive relationships with their peers and teachers across the school. The Grade 6 buddies have been an excellent support for our new Foundation students and have helped them feel supported as they get use to school life.

**Start Up Program -** During the first two weeks of school, our students have participated in a wide range of start-up activities to help ensure a positive and enjoyable start to their school year. As part of our Start Up program this year, all our students took part in the Proactivity incursion today and they had an amazing time. The Proactivity team were so impressed with our students' team work and collaboration, and they said thay can't wait to come back again in 2026!

**School Council Elections** If you are interested in the overall operation of our school and would like to have some input into its present and future direction, perhaps you would like to nominate for membership of School Council. School Council meets once a month with meetings usually lasting for about an hour and a half. Two of our current school council members will be finishing up with us this year and one member have come to the end of their two-year term, so there will be 3 parent vacancies on School Council this year, so please think about nominating for one of these important positions. Nominations for the vacancies will open on Monday 12 Feb and close on **Monday 26 Feb 2024**.

A Call for Nominations and School Council Information Sheet will be sent out on Compass on Monday 12 February and paper copies will also be available in the Office. The information sheet will outline the timeline for the Election process and provide you with information regarding the role of a School Councillor. **Meet and Greet Interviews** Thank you to all family members who took part in our Meet and Greet Interviews at the start of this term. Our teachers have all mentioned how valuable this process is in getting to know their students and their family members. If you were unable to take part in the interview process, please contact your classroom teachers to arrange a suitable time to have a chat.

**Arrival and Departure Times** We are aware that arrival and departure times for students may vary depending on family circumstances and transport arrangements for each family, however if possible, it is best if students arrive between 8.40am and 8.50am so that they are ready for the start of the school day when the first bell goes at 8.50am. We have teachers on duty between 8.45am and 9.00am and also after school between 3.30pm and 3.45pm for students who may need assistance.

If you need to drop your child at school prior to 8.40am or if you are unable to pick them up before 3.50pm in the afternoon, we recommend that you enrol them in our TheirCare Out of School Hours Care program, to ensure their safety and wellbeing during this time.

If your child arrives at school after 9:00 am, they will need to go straight to the Office so that they can be signed into Compass to ensure that our rolls are accurate and to be given a printed pass to hand to their classroom teacher. If your child needs to leave school at any time for an appointment and/or for an early dismissal, parents or carers need to come into the Office to arrange collection and to allow Office staff to enter an early departure time on Compass. Please note that unless a request is received in writing, students can only be released to a known adult. Similarly, students cannot leave the school ground by themselves at any time throughout the school day unless a written request is received from a parent/guardian and permission is given by the Principal.

Playground Safety To prevent accidents, students are not permitted to ride bikes, scooters or skate boards in the school or across the front of the school at any time. To ensure safety for all our students, we do not allow students to play on the playground equipment before school at any time; and students are only allowed to play on the equipment after school if supervised by their parents. Please also note that school rules related to playground and equipment use apply at all times.

#### Principal's Report continued...

Mobile Phones and Wearable Communication Devices We understand that students may bring a personal mobile phone or a wearable communication device to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school. Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and stored in the school office during school hours. Students who have the Principal's approval must place their phone in the school office before 9.00 am and them for collect them from the Office at 3.30 pm. Wearable communication devices, such as watches, can be switched on throughout the day, but the communication function must be turned off during school hours. Please refer to our <u>Mobile Phones and</u> <u>Wearable Communication Devices Policy</u> for further details.

**Dogs on School Grounds** Please also note that, with the exception of education support dogs and therapy/guide dogs, dogs are not permitted in the school grounds and we would ask parents not to bring dogs to school, even if they are on leads.

**Newsletters Distributed Fortnightly** Compass, our online communication portal, is our main communication device and it enables us to send important messages to our school community on a regular basis and at point of need, which is a real benefit to our school. In addition to the other messages sent out on Compass, we also distribute a school newsletter on a fortnightly basis which highlights the important events and contains valuable information for our school community.

Annual Privacy Reminder Our school collects, uses, discloses and stores student and parent personal information for standard school functions or where permitted by law, as stated in the <u>Schools' Privacy Policy</u>. Please take time to remind yourself of the school's collection statement, found on our website <u>www.strathps.vic.edu.au/privacy-information</u>. **Student Insurance Schemes** It is important to remind parents that the Department of Education (DE) does not provide personal accident insurance for students and that parents/guardians are responsible for paying the costs of medical treatment for injured students, including transport costs e.g. ambulance. Student insurance can be privately purchased and is available from commercial insurers. The DE cannot advise parents/guardians on whether to purchase a student accident policy or which policy to purchase.

Ambulance Cover We also strongly advise all parents to join an Ambulance cover scheme because the costs for transport can be very high. In the event of an emergency requiring additional medical intervention it is a DET requirement that we call an Ambulance to transport children to hospital irrespective of whether parents have ambulance cover or not. While this decision is not taken lightly, and we will make every effort to contact parents, this is not always possible and can be costly for families without ambulance cover.

Safe Travel To and From School It is important that parents discuss their expectations about how their children travel to and from school and how to be safe. It is safer if the students travel directly to and from school and that they do not play in transit.

Non Smoking Area As a government department, the school is a non-smoking area and smoking is not permitted anywhere on the school grounds.

**Personal belongings** All belongings, including clothing, must be clearly marked with the student's name and should be checked regularly to ensure all items remain clearly marked. Please do not allow students to bring valuable items to school as the DET and Strathfieldsaye Primary School do not hold insurance for personal property and valuable items brought to school by students, staff or parents.

**Money brought to school** It is requested that money be sent in a sealed envelope with the student's name, home group, amount and the reason for its enclosure on the front of the envelope. Any money that is be sent to school with your child must be handed directly to the office. When siblings bring money for other family members, please mark this clearly on the envelope with written details of each student, home group and teacher.

**Parent/Guardian/Visitor Sign-in/out** For emergency purposes, all parents/guardians and visitors who are in the school during the school day (9.00am – 3.30pm) must call at the office and sign in at the book at the front counter on arrival at school and sign out when departing.

Safe Driving and Parking around School We have been advised by the City of Greater Bendigo to alert parents to the following information regarding parking and driving near schools. The responsibility for student safety is an important one for the whole community and I would ask all drivers to take particular care around school zones.

"The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to schools is a major concern to the safety of children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with the parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school. Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, park or drive on resident's nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park.

A number of schools have time restricted areas that assist with the pickup and drop off of students and these restrictions must be adhered to. **Drivers** should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line. The law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police will conduct random patrols throughout the school year to ensure that motorists are adhering to the road rules."





#### A Message from The City of Greater Bendigo

#### Increased Mosquito Activity and Threat of Arbovirus in Greater Bendigo Region

The City of Greater Bendigo region has been identified as having increased Mosquito activity through its mosquito surveillance program. Some of the mosquitos identified by the surveillance program are capable of carrying infectious diseases. Over the coming weeks, we expect the population of mosquitos to continue to increase, resulting in a higher risk of exposure to these infectious diseases

Management of mosquitos requires a community effort. You can protect yourself by doing the following:

- Wear loose fitting clothing when outdoors.
- Use effective mosquito repellents on exposed skin containing DEET or picaridin.

You can increase your protection by:

- Ensuring your buildings are fitted with well maintained flyscreens or other physical insect barriers.
- Checking any rainwater tanks and water storage devices are sealed or fitted with mesh screens.

If you have identified increased mosquito at your premises, I encourage you to engage a licensed pest controller to assist you identify and apply appropriate chemical controls at your site.

Should you identify areas in your neighbourhood supporting the breeding of mosquitos, please do not hesitate in notifying the City. Together we can minimise the spread of mosquito borne disease in our community.

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








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
