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Principal's Report

2024 Class Placement Process Over the last five weeks, school staff have invested many hours considering our students' social, emotional and academic requirements, their friendship requests and any individual student needs that have been shared by parents so that we can put together the best possible combinations for our 2024 classes. With careful consideration, we have been able to ensure that each child has been placed with one or more of the friends they requested and we have also been able to accommodate most of the parent requests that we received.

Given the time and careful consideration that has already been put into this process, I wanted to let parents know that we will not have the flexibility to make any changes to class groupings from this point on. If your child has any worries about their class placement after they participate in their orientation session on Tuesday 12 Dec. please chat to your child's 2023 classroom teacher and let them know so that they can help support your child in getting to know their new classmates and work through their worries prior to the end of the year.

2024 Room Changes Next year, we have decided to turn our current Gr 2 classrooms into a Specialist Hub. Rm 9 will become our STEM Room, Rm 10 will be our Performing Arts Room, Rm 11 will be our LOTE Room and Rm 12 will be our Digital Technologies Room on Mon-Wed and Chaplain's Room on Thu-Fri. Energy Breakthrough

Last week 16 students from Strath PS participated in the 2023 Energy Breakthrough event at Maryborough. The event takes place over 3 days with students participating in 3 separate assessments for the event.

A presentation to judges about the vehicles, their features, materials and the environmental effects of motorised transport.

The second part involves students showing their understanding of the design and construction features of the vehicles and what makes them safe to use. The final assessment takes place on the track. Students ride the vehicles for a 14 hour period, relay style.

While the event took place last week, students have been working hard during the term to prepare their presentations, learning to ride the vehicles and all the various complexities of their operation. This has involved many hours after school and on Saturday mornings at a number of different venues.

On the race track, students were often challenged with different situations, accidents in front of them, following the instructions of officials and occasionally even being involved in a minor bingle of their own.

At the end of the event, although we didn't feature amongst the place getters for the event, Students shad a great time and represented our school well always showing our CORE values. This was especially evident when I received a number of comments from the officials and other schools in the pit lane.

Jade would also like to say a huge thankyou to the volunteers who have helped make the transition easy, your help is very much appreciated.




School Canteen Information


- The school canteen operates on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday between 11-12pm



A Message from The City of Greater Bendigo

Increased Mosquito Activity and Threat of Arbovirus in Greater Bendigo Region

The City of Greater Bendigo region has been identified as having increased Mosquito activity through its mosquito surveillance program. Some of the mosquitos identified by the surveillance program are capable of carrying infectious diseases. Over the coming weeks, we expect the population of mosquitos to continue to increase, resulting in a higher risk of exposure to these infectious diseases.

Management of mosquitos requires a community effort. You can protect yourself by doing the following:

- Wear loose fitting clothing when outdoors.
- Use effective mosquito repellents on exposed skin containing DEET or picaridin.


You can increase your protection by:

- Ensuring your buildings are fitted with well maintained flyscreens or other physical insect barriers.
- Checking any rainwater tanks and water storage devices are sealed or fitted with mesh screens.

If you have identified increased mosquito at your premises, I encourage you to engage a licensed pest controller to assist you identify and apply appropriate chemical controls at your site.

Should you identify areas in your neighbourhood supporting the breeding of mosquitos, please do not hesitate in notifying the City. Together we can minimise the spread of mosquito borne disease in our community.











School preparedness and pre-emptive actions for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings indicate how dangerous a fire would be if one started in those conditions and provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life. They can be a trigger for action in community and for school and household level fire plans.

Schools and children's services listed on the Department of Education and Training's Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and those at some

lower risk of bushfire or grassfire on the Category 4 list will be closed when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their Bureau of Meteorology district.

Schools and early childhood services listed on the Department of Education and Training's Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and those at lower risk of bushfire or grassfire on the Category 4 list take pre-emptive actions on elevated fire danger days to minimise the risk of being caught in a fire in these conditions. The category of risk (per the BARR or Category 4 list) determines the actions that the school or early childhood service will need to take on days of elevated fire danger.

Our school has been identified as being one of these schools at high bushfire or grassfire risk and is listed on the Bushfire at Risk Register (BARR), as a Category 3 school.

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in North Country Fire District fire district.

The department will advise our school of the potential for a Catastrophic fire danger rating as information becomes available, however the pre-emptive closure will be confirmed by 1pm the day prior to Catastrophic fire danger day.

Fire danger ratings are forecast by the Bureau of Meteorology up to four days in advance. Should a Catastrophic day be forecast, we will notify you of the potential closure by an email or hard copy letter and Compass Newsfeed. Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- Depending on which fire weather district is impacted, bus route cancellations may affect our school.

Families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.


As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters.
