This term students in STEM are focusing on key elements of the design and technology curriculum. This looks at areas of materials technology, as well as concepts such as food and fibre, materials technology and design and engineering principles.

Students in foundation have been working on different activities around the picture story book Stellarphant which celebrates the contributions various animals have made to the worlds space programs.

Students in grade 1 and 2 have been learning about our food sources and where our food comes from looking at the difference between processed and non processed foods.

Students in grade 3 have worked on designing and building towers using icy-pole sticks and masking tape. Students were challenged to build the tallest tower they could using only 40 icy-pole sticks.

Students in grade 4 have been designing their own wearable technologies, and comparing them to what people in the 1990s thought we would be using.

Grade 5 students have had a focus on exploring remote environments and designing remote operating vehicles (ROVs) to explore one of these.

Grade 6 students have been investigating the design and inventions of Leonardo Da Vinci including his designs for many modern machines back in the 15th century.







Grades 3&4 made Paper puppets using layering techniques and paper folding.

A Message from The City of Greater Bendigo

Increased Mosquito Activity and Threat of Arbovirus in Greater Bendigo Region

The City of Greater Bendigo region has been identified as having increased Mosquito activity through its mosquito surveillance program. Some of the mosquitos identified by the surveillance program are capable of carrying infectious diseases. Over the coming weeks, we expect the population of mosquitos to continue to increase, resulting in a higher risk of exposure to these infectious diseases.

Management of mosquitos requires a community effort. You can protect yourself by doing the following:

- Wear loose fitting clothing when outdoors.
- Use effective mosquito repellents on exposed skin containing DEET or picaridin.


You can increase your protection by:

- Ensuring your buildings are fitted with well maintained flyscreens or other physical insect barriers.
- Checking any rainwater tanks and water storage devices are sealed or fitted with mesh screens.

If you have identified increased mosquito at your premises, I encourage you to engage a licensed pest controller to assist you identify and apply appropriate chemical controls at your site.

Should you identify areas in your neighbourhood supporting the breeding of mosquitos, please do not hesitate in notifying the City. Together we can minimise the spread of mosquito borne disease in our community.


- The school canteen operates on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday between 11:20—12pm & 1:30—2pm


