MOBILE PHONE AND WEARABLE COMMUNICATION DEVICES POLICY

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Strathfieldsaye Primary School's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal mobile devices, such as smart watches, during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Strathfieldsaye Primary School and,
- 2. Students' personal mobile phones and other personal mobile devices, such as smart watches, brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

A mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as smart watches.

POLICY

Strathfieldsaye Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Strathfieldsaye Primary School:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours
- Wearable communication devices, such as watches, can be switched on throughout the day, but the communication function must be turned off during school hours.
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Strathfieldsaye Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

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Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Strathfieldsaye Primary School are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so.

Please note that Strathfieldsaye Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the [Strathfieldsaye Primary School's Personal Property Policy AND/OR the Department's Claims for Property Damage and Medical Expenses policy.

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Strathfieldsaye Primary School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Strathfieldsaye Primary School students are required to hand their mobile phone or hand held device into the school administration office to be placed in a lockable drawer.

Wearable communication devices, **such as smart watches**, can be left switched on throughout the day, but the communication and notification functions must be turned off during school hours.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Strathfieldsaye Primary School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing. Student Wellbeing and Engagement and/or Code of Conduct or Bullying policies.

At Strathfieldsaye Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones, or other communication device, is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- during assessments

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
 - o Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
 - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones</u> — <u>Student Use Policy</u>.

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> are:

1. Learning-related exceptions

3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

When students are offsite (not on school grounds) and insupervised with parental permission	Risk assessment planning documentation

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Strathfieldsaye Primary School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones and other communication devices

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school



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COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Available publicly on our school's website (or insert other online parent/carer/student communication method)
- Included in staff induction processes and staff training
- Included in school newsletter and Compass newsfeed
- Included in staff handbook/manual
- Discussed at annual staff briefings/meetings
- Included in transition and enrolment packs
- Discussed at parent information nights/sessions
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
- Staff Professional Learning occurs at the start of each school year
